Recently, I attended the funeral of a twenty year-old woman. Her mother had been our co-worker when her child was born as a healthy, beautiful little girl. At the age of five, she became seriously ill with meningitis. It was hard for the parents to accept that their child was suddenly severely handicapped. For ten years we took care of the girl in Bethesda, and the last years of her life, her mother did at home. I was worried how she would deal with the death of her daughter. At the funeral she took me aside and said, "All of these special needs kids




are miracles. They are challenged themselves, but my own daughter's life was a challenge to my faith and trust in God. Now I would like to come back to Bethesda and help take care of these special children." I am

convinced this mother will be a blessing to our residents because she understands their needs and their hearts.

With extreme hesitancy, her parents attended our worship service on the day of their daughter's baptism. After the service during the luncheon reception, her parents witnessed the love, gifts, flowers and homemade



cake received from other young people in church. Then after hearing their words of encouragement and blessing to her, they seemed to relax. Miss O's father later told me, "Now I know how much my daughter is loved by these other church members. She has found her place. Thank you." Please pray for the salvation of these parents.

This year Miss O graduated from High School. She asked if she could be a Sunday School teacher for high school kids, and help them to come to faith in Jesus and follow Him.

The past several months have been very difficult for a woman in our church and her husband, Mr. and Mrs. G, whose adult son had been suffering from mental illness for many years. In February, this elderly couple returned home to discover their son dead by his own doing in his room, the place that he had rarely left for at least the past three years. I was with them when the police conducted their preliminary investigation, and accompanied them to the morgue.

The mother has been a member of our church for years. Her son made a profession of faith and was baptized more than ten years ago, but that was a short time of normalcy in a troubled life. He stopped speaking to me and coming to church.

Since the death of this man, some of our church members have been able to reach out and attempt to comfort not only the mother, but also her husband.

Mr. G had never attended our regular church meetings. Since that horrible day, he has accompanied his wife to church on Sunday mornings on several occasions and also attended a small group meeting. Now, for the very first time, we can talk about spiritual things. Please pray with us that something of eternal value will take hold inside of him and lead him to be truly born again. Since May, Taiwan has been strictly locked down and they cannot come to indoor meetings. Nonetheless, Mr. and Mrs. G pray together every evening! May the Spirit comfort and heal them both.

Thank you for encouraging us through your prayer and interest in our life and ministries. Out of the abundance of the grace we have received, we want to continue to encourage others to love, follow and serve Jesus Christ.

Thank you for your prayer and financial support for our missionary work in this city of Sendai in Miyagi Prefecture. As the COVID-19 pandemic rages in the cities of



Mrs. K is an eighty-year-old woman whose home was severely damaged by the devastating tsunami ten years ago. She lives near Ms. I, also a victim of the tsunami, and a baptized believer in our church. Mrs. K's husband is in a nursing home and she lives alone. Ms. I helps her with her housework.

One day, Ms. I phoned Mrs. K's daughter in Tokyo to see how she was doing. Mrs. K's daughter said she had become a Christian! She begged Ms. I to take her mother to church!



Until recently, Mrs. K was a sun god worshiper. But her daughter convinced her to attend worship services with Ms. I. The strong convicting and comforting presence of the Holy Spirit was so evident in Mrs. K's face as she earnestly listened to the Sunday sermons, occasionally shedding tears as truth touched her heart. In February of this year, she confessed her faith in Jesus as

Savior. After receiving baptism instruction, she was baptized in July.

On March 11, 2021 we remembered the 10th anniversary of the great Northeast Japan earthquake and tsunami, as well as the 3rd anniversary of our church's ministry in Sendai. We still experience aftershocks of that earthquake, but in God's mercy we also experience great surges of His grace in the lives of these victims. Continue to pray, please, for souls to be saved!
